Calling all parents whose kids with Down syndrome will be entering Kindergarten in the fall of 2020!


Do you want your child included in a general education Kindergarten class? DSC's Ready, Set, Kindergarten program (RSK) can provide you with the tools you need to advocate for your child. In its third year, RSK is a coalition of parents committed to the inclusion of their children with Down syndrome in general education classrooms. Parents will meet one Saturday a month for six months during the year before their children start Kindergarten to educate themselves, strategize, and form a support network. Once these students enter Kindergarten, the parents will continue to offer support, idea sharing and problem solving to ensure students are receiving an inclusive education

vvnat inspired you to develop Ready, Set, Kindergarten? We were inspired by the attending many inclusion conferences and workshops including All Born (in) in Portland and NDSC national conference and wanting to have an option in the Puget Sound area. We also heard from parents who had their kids fully included in general education and parents who wished theirs were. We recognized the need for knowledge about inclusion in the Puget Sound area and wanted to be involved in changing the system. We also wanted to empower ourselves as parental advocates for our own children with Down syndrome, both of whom will start Kindergarten this fall.

What does the series of classes include? We wanted RSK to be a combination of education, advocacy, and support. Our program consists of 6 sessions starting in October and finishing in April, for parents of kids who are entering Kindergarten the next fall. Each session is a different topic including advocacy, IEPs, accommodations, behavior, and a parent panel. We also have plenty of opportunities for discussion and questions. We want parents to form a community to ask

questions and share experiences.
