As we researched adoption, we knew we wanted to adopt a child who wouldn't otherwise have a chance at a permanent family and we found China had many waiting children with lots of medical needs.

It was really scary! Just like having a biological child, you don't really know what you're getting into! We had a small medical file and a few videos in which we could see Ben was spunky and had a strong personality that would fit with our family. Although we didn't have much experience with Down syndrome, we were smitten by this chubby toddler on the other side of the world. But still, we were terrified to enter the unknown!



A volunteer who is paired with one ambassador for the duration of an ambassadors training to assist with the writing and practicing of a speech. Speech coaches help ambassadors in areas of brainstorming, organization, and editing. Speech coaches should not be writing speeches for their matched ambassadors, but serve as a guide/mentor who provides one-on-one attention as needed.
