Understanding Adolescence & Puberty Program 2021 Winter Session



Registration Now Open!

The program is now open to all tweens and teens with intellectual disabilities.

Tweens and teens with Down syndrome go through puberty during the same years as their typically developing peers (ages 9-14), and as with all children, they have questions and concerns about the changes affecting their bodies during this time of their life.

Join **Dr. Rebecca Partridge**, head of Down Syndrome program, and **Beth Olenchek**, a health educator at Virginia Mason, and co-teachers **Ari Charoni** and **Ayman King** for the seven-week program.

This program will be held virtually via Zoom, on Saturdays, starting on **Saturday, February 6th**. The program will begin with a one-hour online session providing an overview of what parents and caregivers can expect from the classes. The following six sessions are gender-specific and each meeting is 30-45 minutes.

Each family will receive two books that focus on teaching children with intellectual disabilities about their bodies, boundaries, and sexuality. Additional materials will be sent to parents and caregivers each week.

Cost: \$125

The Understanding Adolescence and Puberty program has a one-time fee, including all books and materials.

"New ways to support parents and preschool-age siblings of children with developmental and health concerns."

The **Sibling Support Project and Influents Innovations** are creating an app called SIBTime* to help parents – especially those from minority and rural communities – easily and meaningfully address the social, emotional, and behavioral health needs of their 3-5 year-old typically developing children.

They wish to invite families who have a child who has a disability, and another typically developing child ages 3-5 to participate in a 1.5 hour online focus group. During the focus group, they will discuss the special ways parents connect with their typically developing 3-5 year-old child and ask them to share feedback on some of the app's draft content and features. The focus groups will be scheduled according to parents' availability and parents will receive \$75 for their participation.
